Fred graduated from the University of Maryland in 1980 and coached their Golf team while turning pro the next year. He has won events on both tours and is also known for his sense of humor and devotion as a husband, father and Christian.

**Before** this month was last month and our March MOC Breakfast program included John Eve, Chairman and Founder of ROW KIDS which stands for Rivers of the World Educating the Children of the World. John told our audience that ROW KIDS is a not-for-profit Christian Ministry that is dedicated to children in dire poverty throughout Developing and 3rd World Countries. "Our goal is to assist the children of the world, in the communities that they live, by attempting to break the cycle of poverty and economic exploitation through the improvement of their educational opportunities", John said during his compelling slide presentation. ROW KIDS programs emphasize the educational well-being of individual children. Education programs focus on removing obstacles to school attendance and performance and providing each child a means to obtain the necessary education to bring them out of their poverty cycle.
